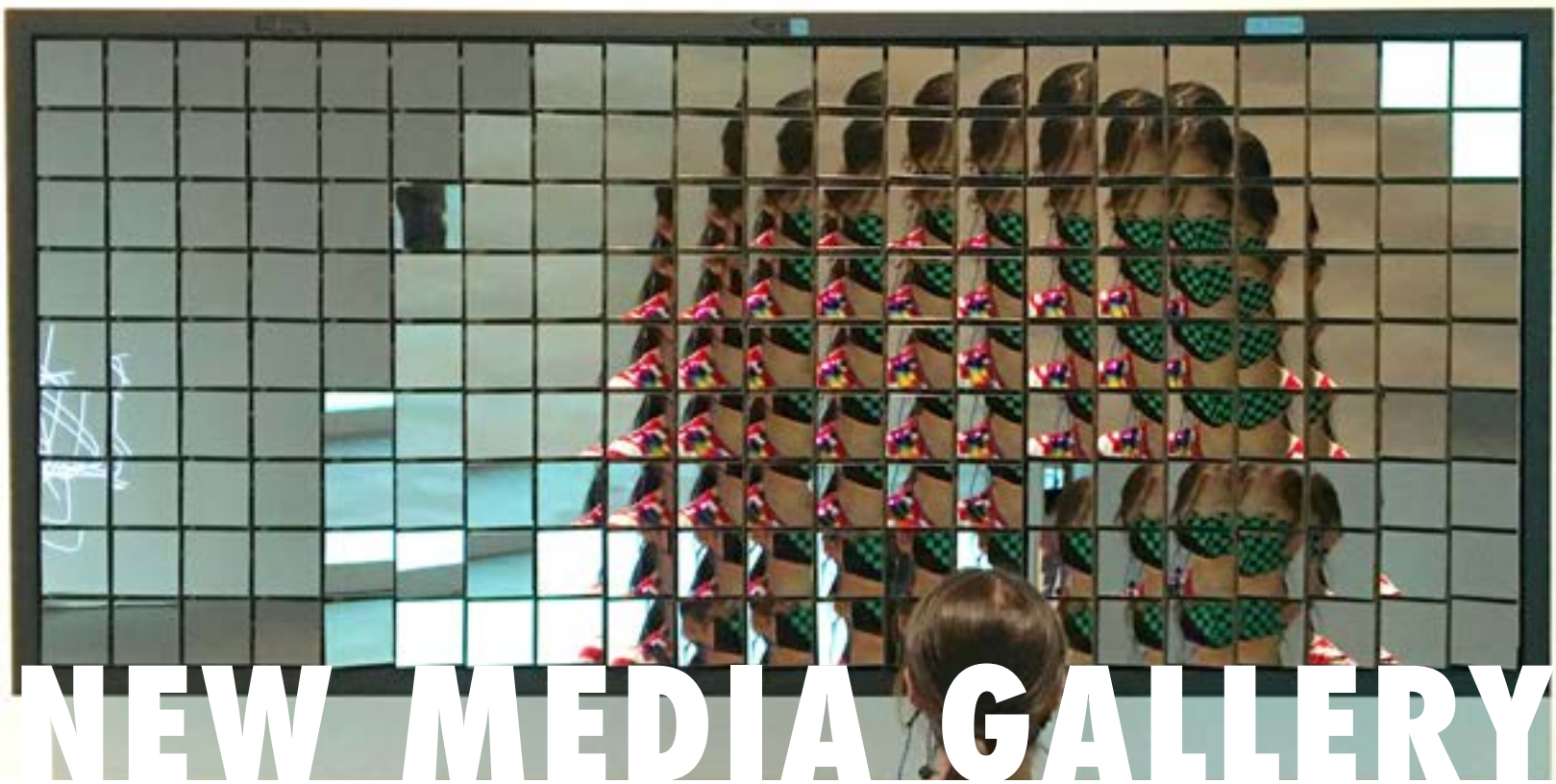

MirNs WORKSHOPS

This exciting field trip offers a Zoom multi-media tour of the MirNs exhibition + a pre-activity video + a live art workshop taught over Zoom. Explore innovative approaches to portraiture and how machines 'see', through machine learning, mimicry & robotics. The workshop will introduce students to Mask-making through Augmented Reality (AR). Exercises will encourage critical thinking and how we create meaning through art. Students will use SparkAR to make their own virtual portrait masks. Masks throughout history have had powerful symbolic, cultural and poetic associations. This theme can be a great supplement to curriculum subjects in Indigenous Learning, History, Science and Social Sciences. Access to smart devices, a computer installed with Spark AR, & art supplies are required.

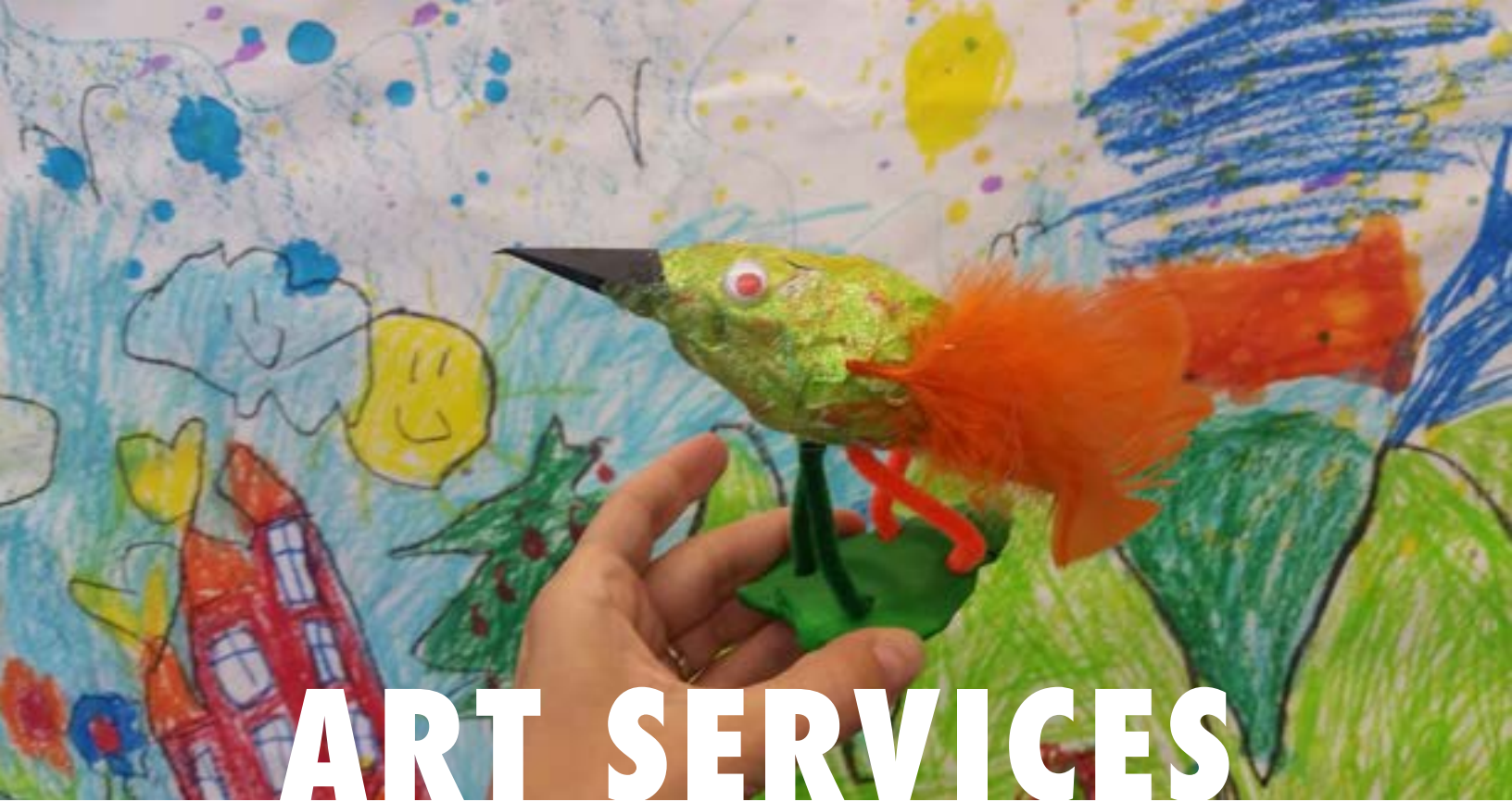



