NEWMEDIAGALLERY

ASSEMBLY EXHIBITION

This exhibition touches on the human desire to collect, build and excavate in order to expose some kind of truth. Assembly dwells on the ordering of things: information, data, objects, ideas, sound, and knowledge inside the construction of imaginary spaces. Three phenomenal artists take us through collected histories, processes and systems of ordering. In her large-scale video projection 'Archive', Indonesian artist Fiona Tan has digitally reconstructed the archive of Paul Otlet; a failed utopian dream he hoped would bring universal knowledge, peace and understanding. Swiss artist Zimoun constructs a cylindrical tower of containers, defined by beating sound; a closed system that develops its own rules and behaviours. In a 'remote corner of the server' UK artist Elizabeth Price allows her chanting 'Administrators' to sort, archive and interpret a great collection of records, objects and photographs that define (or do they?) the archaeology of a lost civilization.

Working in small groups, students create personal identity boxes, looking at different configurations to represent the key ideas, attitudes, and group identities. Robotic fundamentals are then demonstrated using our collection of LittleBits modular circuits. Students then experiment and play with robotics; light, motion and sound as well as mixed media and and their identity boxes to create groupings and constructions that represent their group story... Their Assembly. Group discussions, demonstrations and lessons make this workshop a creative and exciting day out.

SHAPING ELECTRONIC SOUND: INTRO

This exciting class covers the basics of sound synthesis. This class will give you techniques for generating electronic sound from scratch with some introduction to the theory and practice. Explore both digital and analog synthesizers. Find out how to identify each type of synthesizer and what sounds you can expect it to produce. 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SAMSON V

Samson V, launched in 1937, is the last surviving wooden steam-powered sternwheeler built for the federal Department of Public Works for use as a snag-boat on the Fraser River. At 418 gross tons and 115' on deck, she was the fifth in a series of similar vessels dating back to 1884 that cleared debris, maintained aids to navigation and government docks, performed surveys and served other functions as needed.
